ACADEMIC STANDARDS PETITION COVER PAGE

Instructions. Use this form to capture summary information about your petition to the UVA Engineering Committee on Academic Standards (CAS). Your petition *must* include all the following elements:

- 1. this cover page, filled out completely
- 2. a narrative letter describing, in your own words, the rationale for your petition specifically addressing any mitigating circumstances
 - a. For grade appeals, please include steps you took to resolve this matter with the course instructor and department chair.
- 3. a current, unofficial transcript

and it may include:

- 4. Supporting documentation from your advisor, instructors, medical care provider(s), or others with knowledge of your situation (submit only if relevant to your case)
 - a. If medical documentation is relevant, a simple letter confirming care will suffice. The letter may also include a recommendation about your petition from your care provider(s). We do not need details of your medical condition.

Submit your petition package as a <u>single</u> PDF document via email to <u>engineering-undgrad@virginia.edu</u>. Incomplete petitions (i.e., those without the required elements 1, 2, and 3 above) will not be reviewed. Waiver of suspension must be received by the deadline stated in your academic suspension notification letter, or the date conveyed to you directly by the dean; late petitions will not be reviewed.

For fall grade appeals, you must initiate the appeal by March 1 of the following spring term: a spring or summer course

must be appealed by October 1 of the following fall term. For a course offered during your final term, you must appeal before graduation. A disagreement over the quality of your work is not sufficient grounds for an appeal.
